"The Golden Age Of Female Impersonation"

PART II

Because of the dearth of published material on cross-dressing, we are left with just a few biographies of those accomplished mimics who have created an indelible mark in the annals of show business. The two most famous 18th century female mimics were Abbe deChoisy and Chevalier d'Eon. They were two Frenchmen who would wear feminine apparel and makeup and mimic feminine mannerisms to the point where it was disputed that they were men. Their beauty, grace and charm aroused the ire of many French women and it is reasonable to believe that these two impersonators were subjected to harassment because of jealousy.

The more famous of these two cross-dressers is Abbe Francois Temoleon de Choisy. We must credit him with the right of precedence since he came first and before d'Eon. In my researches in libraries throughout the world, in my consultations with dealers of antique and rare books as well as extensive correspondences with theatrical personalities the world over, no other impersonators have received as much attention, praise and

mixed comments than the famed mimic, Abbe deChoisy.

Those of you who want to read more about this impersonator will benefit from an outstanding book entitled *Transvestism Today*, by Edward Podolsky, M.D. and Carlson Wade. Born in 1644, in Paris, young deChoisy was said to have been the idol of his Mama's eye. She loved to dress and undress her lovely boy, arrange his hair in the latest fashions and was wont to regard him as her favourite doll. In that time of history, young French boys would wear dresses until they were about 6 or 7 years of age and were then allowed to wear boyish garments. But it was different with deChoisy.

His mother would not let him grow up to be a male; after his 6th birthday, deChoisy continued to wear female garments, was taught all the

proper mannerisms and etiquette as well as decorum to be observed by a young Paris girl.

The boy-girl was given a room outfitted in all the feminine finery and frills that would be more appropriate in a room for a girl. He was given the best female dresses, undergarments, silks and satins. His mother trained him in tight corsets, dressed him in pantaloons, hoop shirts, laces and ribbons. Needless to say, it did not take long until deChoisy was so accustomed to feminine dress that he enjoyed this little game.

This gay young boy was delighted with his masquerade; he soon selected his own female clothes, knew which satins, ruffles, laces and jewelry were to be worn to create proper fashion harmony. He became an expert in makeup and would spend hours before a looking glass working deftly to apply rouge, lipstick, powder, mascare and other feminine artifacts.

DeChoisy admitted, in his *Memoirs*, that he thoroughly delighted in masquerading as a female and would have disliked being forced to dress as a male and act that masculine role. He also wrote that he had developed female characteristics—a narrow waist, a high pectoral development that could have doubled for breasts, because he had worn high corsets ever since he was a young child.

At the age of 15, he already considered himself to be a symbol of female fashion; so did most of Paris who knew of him. DeChoisy was seen at the theatre, at the opera, public affairs, even out shopping, dressed as a woman. He had many young lady friends and

would go to gay affairs with them, dressed as a female, needless to say.

His face was smooth; again, the results of hair plucking. He had pierced ears and wore the best of earrings. His mother would introduce him to strangers and members of the court as "Mademoiselle."

In 1662, his mother passed on. Young deChoisy, now 18, thought he could make a break with the past by adopting his natural role—that of a male. He had assumed that his mother's influence was over; no longer would he have to dress as a woman to placate her strange whims. These whims, by the way, have never been explained and most certainly could furnish us with much insight into the peculiarities of this type of behaviour. Perhaps some researcher of the future will endeavor to delve into the motivations of a mother who wants her boy to become a girl.

DeChoisy did, indeed, dress as a male for a short time. Obviously, he could not make a successful enough change and returned to his female attire. His friends and household help were told to call him "Mademoiselle." In years to come, this was changed to "Madame." It is said that his local parish priest accepted deChoisy's penchant for pretending to be a woman.

In his *Memoirs*, the young deChoisy tells us that he was once visited by a young lady. Several others in the retinue urged her to remove her feminine clothes and, in exchange, to wear some of deChoisy's discarded boy's outfits. This was an entertaining diversion and she promptly transformed herself into a "male." This so

pleased deChoisy that he was her constant companion, escorted her to various social functions and then announced his desire to marry her.

She accepted. It must have certainly been an unusual wedding—the young lady in a groom's outfit while deChoisy was lavishly attired as a stunning bride in the latest of bridal gowns and accompanying frills and finery.

But even the gay French thought this was too much. Gossips spread all sorts of rumors. DeChoisy decided it would be best to stop the wagging tongues by moving out of the area, settling in another district where he was unknown. Here he would appear as a female and keep his true identity a complete secret. He bought a house, moved in with a new staff of servants, all of whom assumed he was a woman. They all addressed him as Madame La Comtesse de Barres.

"She" was the social rage of the community, "She" was well-mannered, carefully groomed, lovely as a flower. Everyone invited "her" to lavish dinners. "She" was seen at the theatre, spoken about as being lovely and gracious. No one knew that "she" was really a he.

As if to convince himself that his disguise was foolproof, deChoisy invited a young lady into his house. She took up residence as he taught her proper dress, deportment and feminine manners. DeChoisy had a gay time in training this young lady who never suspected "Madame" of being a Monsieur." DeChoisy was expert in teaching feminine mannerisms. He taught this girl how to properly flatter her

figure, how to act as a "lady," based upon his own experiences, how to arrange floral bouquets, set table arrangements, act as a proper hostess. Indeed, he was a better teacher than any woman of the period might have been.

Encouraged by his powers to deceive, deChoisy took in a second pupil. She, however, was not as innocent as all that and suspected something was amiss. No one knows how she discovered that "Madame" was a "Monsieur" but it was enough to cause deChoisy to pull up his skirts and escape for Paris.

After fleeing his disgraceful discovery, young deChoisy established himself in Paris as "Madame" deChoisy. He would dress in the latest of fashions, wear a figure trainer until he had an enviable hour-glass shape, use laces, high heels, perfumes and was a familiar sight about the streets of Paris. As before, there was no suspicion about his true sex.

In 1673, he became the inheritor of a title, Abbe, together with an ample income. He went to Saint Seine in the province of Burgundy to claim this title. Three years later, after having made many friends among those of influence, he was made a secretary to Cardinal Bouillon and even attended a Roman religious conclave. This new post brought him many friends. One of these was Cardinal deRetz who went so far as to invite him to an elaborate royal ball.

It was an invitation that deChoisy could not resist. He reportedly spent days in select-

ing the proper garments. and spent hours before a mirror to make up his body and his face. He appeared in "full drag" at this big "blowout" and was quite the rage of all those present. They admired his feminine dress and completely feminine personality, flattered and envied him. DeChoisy felt happy again.

Returning to Paris, he pulled strings in order to receive an appointment to an Embassy. This was accomplished in 1685. In that year, he was invited to accompany Chevalier deChaumont on a trip to Siam. The King of Siam indicated interest in Catholicism and might want to become a convert, it was said. And so, together with the Chevalier, the young deChoisy made the trip. Needless to say, DeChoisy was dressed in his very best of female finery. Throughout the trip, from start to return, he was dressed as a female. Few knew his true identity.

DeChoisy was well-educated and intelligent to the point where he was ordained a priest, bestowed with numerous ecclesiastical preferments.

There was a brief period in his life when he played female roles on the stage. Unhappily, little is known of this period in his life but we may well assume that he played his role with the utmost perfection.

The end came in 1724 at the age of 80, in Paris. His passing leaves us with historical works and accounts of his life and his gossipy *Memoirs*, written in his younger days and published in 1737. In this book, he wrote of his adventures as a female, down to the most intimate details.

Now, let us turn to the second most female impersonator. In the year 1728, there was born a male child who would be known as the Chevalier d'Eon deBeaumont. Born in Tonnerre, France, d'Eon was said to have grown up with a feminine figure and was rather of short stature.

Scant information is available about d'Eon. It appears that he, himself, liked female attire and was encouraged to dress thusly by his parents. In his teen-age years, this gay young fellow appeared at fancy-dress balls in complete drag and was reputed to be the most beautiful of all young women in the court of Louis XV.

He was subsequently Paris-educated and admitted to the equivalent of our Bar Association as an attorney-at-law.

In 1755, because of some political situation, he was sent on a secret mission to Russia. In order to become the personal friend of Empress Elizabeth of the Russians, young d'Eon went as a female. He impressed the Russian Empress, became her "lady reader" and learned many military secrets which he conveyed to the King of France.

Because of this success, he was sent on another mission to Russia. During the Seven Years War, young d'Eon was a spy and would also perform diplomatic errands. Most of the time, he dressed as a female and no one in all of Europe was the wiser.

He was also a soldier in the French Army for a brief time, attesting to a strong trace of masculinity.

He was an agent or spy for France, in 1762, going to London, as a female. His career

is dotted with other accomplishments such as minister plenipotentiary, a biography, even an informal representative of Louis XV in London.

Rumours started to spread and there were many who wagered that "she" was really a "he" but the problem was to find out the truth. If any ruffians attempted to waylay him, the transvestite displayed unbelievable powers of strength in not only overcoming his would-be assailants, but beat them mercilessly.

In 1777, when he returned to France, the sovereign ordered him to continue wearing female attire for political reasons. Because there were doubts about his identity, his value as a spy would decrease. It meant that he would have to complete the role of a "drag queen" by wearing female attire at all times and with no exceptions. For an unexplained reason, it is said that d'Eon was upset over this total masquerade but succumbed to the temptation when Marie Antoinette supplied him with a stunning new wardrobe. This was so irresistible that he adopted a female role, *en complete*.

After rumors and gossips had eased, d'Eon returned to London in 1785 as a complete woman. He served the new French government for a while and then settled down to peaceful retirement—still in his role as a woman even though it was no longer necessary.

When this astonishing cross-dresser passed on in 1810, at the age of 82, still a lovely woman, an examination was made. A physician gasped out the truth: "D'Eon was a MAN!"

The name was made im-

mortalized by the sexologist, Havelock Ellis, who coined the word "Eonism" to describe transvestism.

Few have ever matched the artistry of these two. But let us look at several others in the field of theatrical impersonation. There were boys-as-girls such as Bert Swor, Neil O'Brien, "Honey Boy" Evans, Lew Dockstader, the famous teams of Savoy & Brennan, Mackin and Wilson, Gillihan & Murray, Golden and Hughes, Leon and Kelly, Bedini and Arthur, the Bowman Brothers.

It is said that Jerry Cohan, the Father of George M. Cohan, portrayed women in comic skits. The well-known David Warfield "brought down the house" when he played the role of a comic Irish housemaid. You may know of Gyvengy, the European impersonator who was a leader at the Budapest Theatre for many years, playing the role of a warbling chamber maid. Then there was Fregoli, a master (or mistress) in the art of quick changing from one gown to the next. Ristori was an excellent femme mimic when it came to dancing with the utmost of grace.

Nathaniel Field was an English performer, known for playing impersonating roles at the Globe and Blackfriars Theatres. He was termed the "woman actor" of Blackfriars and said that he had first begun impersonating when he was a gay young age of 12. One impersonator who lived his role was James Nokes who dressed as a female, onstage and offstage.

In America, we know of Julian Eltinge who is regarded as the idol of every impersonator. Few could match the art-

istry of this impersonator. There were impersonator acts in the best theatres of the United States. In Carnegie Hall, the famed Francis Renault acted with such perfection that the audiences called him for encore after encore.

Bert Savoy established himself by playing as a red-haired woman of the streets. He performed from the Montana mining camps to the frontiers of Alaska. As part of Savoy and Brennan, he so impressed the theatre world, that he was booked solid for year after year. He played to standing room only.

Others include Barbette, who was also a trapeze artist and good with acrobatic and aerial acts. Special plays were written to feature these impersonator's. The well-known *Charley's Aunt* is just one of them. Not only impersonators but regular actors were featured as the "drag queen," among whom we have Sidney Chaplin, Jose Ferrer, Jack Benny, Ray Bolger, to name a few. Who can ever forget Fred MacMurray as a "male war bride" in a film that had film goers roaring with laughter?

Then we must remember Lew Lehr's farcical interpretation of a "burly dame," and Dave Warfield's side splitting mimic of an Irish biddy as well as burlesque of Anna Held.

Georgie Jessel brought down the house as an impersonator in a Jessel And Edwards act. Wallace Beery will always be remembered for his role as a "dame" in vaudeville. Famed Bobby Clark donned skirts to appear in *Sweethearts*, in 1947. Skipping to recent times, we have Tony Curtis and Jack

Lemmon who masqueraded as women in *Some Like It Hot*. Until the end of the film, the ruse is kept up and when Jack Lemmon exposes himself as a male to one of his admirers (played by Joe E. Brown) who had just proposed, the latter just shrugs and says, "Well, nobody's perfect!"

Unhappily, except for these few aforementioned portrayals, female impersonating as a branch of show business is still showing signs of withering. A slow revival is underway but there is much opposition. Only courage and ambition will help re-establish this form of entertainment as a rightful segment of the theatre.

In the Golden Age, impersonators performed for the sheer pleasure of entertainment as well as profit. If we are ever to experience a revival of that Age, we must also experience a desire to entertain and make profit second.
